Event Background and Description

The recent Asian Development Bank survey reports that the Asia-Pacific region is home to more than 2 billion people under the age of 30, making up 54% of the world's young population. Concurrently, urbanization continues to be a defining megatrend in the region. The Economic and Social Council Youth Forum report highlighted that this has largely affected the youth sector. As a crucial population group contributing to and benefiting from urbanization, it is indispensable to actively engage and integrate youth participation in developing sustainable solutions in urban areas for their generation and the future ones to still enjoy.

The Asia-Pacific Youth Assembly, organized by Habitat for Humanity in coordination with the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UNESCAP), is a significant platform to draw upon the youth's perspective on context-specific urban and housing experiences from across the region, discuss pressing issues and challenges, and craft solutions in building resilient urban communities and on sustainable and affordable housing solutions. This year's youth assembly is anchored on the four themes identified by the UNESCAP's Asia-Pacific Urban Forum—urban and territorial planning and policies, urban climate action and resilience, inclusive urban digitalization and innovation, and urban finance and technical assistance—and housing challenges in the region. This also provides an opportunity for Habitat for Humanity to discuss sustainable and affordable housing issues.

An online international session is in place to better equip all international participants and maximize their participation at the youth assembly. This is followed by the face-to-face event which includes panel discussions from technical experts as well as youth leaders who have successfully implemented projects in their communities. With the guidance of experts and staff, it also includes breakout sessions on key thematic areas and selected project management components to ensure timely and achievable projects – all geared towards increased resilience and sustainability in urban areas across the region. A world café will also be organized where young leaders can share, network, and collaborate with stakeholders.

This year's action-oriented youth assembly provides a space to kick-off more projects and events addressing the problems and challenges revolving around urban communities and housing solutions. It also opens more opportunities to amplify sustainable efforts in urban areas and allowing the youth sector to take up more space in providing solutions.

Objectives

The main aim of the Asia-Pacific Youth Assembly is to provide an opportunity for the youth to (1) learn from experts on urbanization including housing, (2) craft concrete local projects on sustainable urban communities and housing, and (3) network among fellow youth from across the region.



Outputs:

- 1 Online International Session (August 12, 2023). Participants will learn about
 urbanization and housing challenge, strengthen their project ideas, and receive an
 introduction to the Youth Assembly and the Youth Solutions Micro-Grant opportunity.
 Ten youth-led projects will be finalized and will be considered for the Youth Solutions
 Micro-grant.
- 1-Day Face-to-Face Youth Assembly (October 22, 2023). Around 100 young individuals from each participating country in Asia-Pacific will participate in the face-to-face youth assembly in Suwon, South Korea. To ensure that youth will be empowered to implement their projects and contribute to urban and housing solution, they will improve their knowledge on urbanization, community engagement, project management, and other gaps, as identified during the online international session that may be identified depending in their country's context.
- Youth Solutions Micro-Grant (July 15, 2023 April 26, 2024). This initiative will support five youth-led solutions around housing for sustainable urban communities through a \$2,000 micro-grant. The grant will be used to support project implementation, benefitting approximately 2,500 individuals across the region.
- 2 Online Follow-up Sessions (December 5, 2023 and April 26, 2024). Two online follow-up sessions will be available for project mentoring of micro-grant winners, to be followed by the presentation of their implemented projects six months after, from which other young people and youth groups may learn.
